I sit down to read and sometimes read the same page over as I am having trouble focusing. I check my news app too much just hoping that the numbers of those sick or dying will go down. I am afraid that the next number that is shared by the governor will include someone that I love.

This is a time that we need the church more than ever and we now must experience it in a way that we never have before. We need to gather together and breathe in God's spirit of peace, we need to lift up our joys and concerns to join our voices together in prayer, and we need to be a community of faith that seeks out and supports each and every life and voice so that they know that they are valued and loved. White Oak Pond Christian Church has done this before, just not away from our sacred space that has been through things like this for 230 years.

I don't know what the future holds, still I am working with our leadership to make the best decisions for this community each and everyday. There are a few things I do know though.

Our congregation will continue to preach the gospel of love, compassion and mercy while affirming all God's children.

These are the principles that will guide us in these times of crisis. Our congregation must be flexible and solid at the same time, and we can only be this by drawing upon the gifts and strengths that got us here.

Worship: Some of my colleagues were laughing the other day that we always joked about televangelists... and over night we found ourselves ones. It is not ideal, but I must admit that when I saw the faces that first Sunday on my computer screen, I got misty eyed. The fact that we gathered 45-50 people from 4 states to worship God and name the faith that moves us each and every day to see with new eyes was amazing. I don't want to celebrate Easter on a screen rather than in our historic sanctuary, still we are an Easter people and I know that when we do gather again in those familiar pews that it will be a celebration to rival any Easter Sunday.

Care for Others: Our leadership made the decision to change that way we gathered because we loved our neighbors and did not want to risk spreading this virus to others. This has guided our decisions to meet virtually. We are also trying to care for the others that care for us. Our support staff here at Pond works with passion and humility as they care for our community through their different roles. Our financial leadership has discussed that Pond will continue to support these workers as they clean, make music and support the ministries of this church. We are cutting back financially where we can, but our commitment must be to caring for this part of our community as we can.

Preaching the Gospel: This is not a time to change our message. We will not let fear and anxiousness take control. Our faith rests in God and we know that God is an ever present God who is with us. always. Pond is a community where everyone has worth and we will not abandon that. We must embrace kindness and love for all humanity. Our worship will continue to celebrate all the different voices, young, old, female, male... everyone! This is why we chose to go interactive rather than an experience you just watch. Pond has always been participatory, and we will continue to be so.

These next few months will not be easy, still I have seen what God can do through this congregation and I am not afraid. May we continue to find the courage we need, be intentional about our faith, and live lives of abundance and connection. This is not the Lent that was planned this year, still Lent is a time of preparation. May it prepare us for the church this world needs moving forward.
